The World Winter Cities Association for Mayors (WWCAM), initiated by the city of Sapporo in 1981, is a network of winter cities around the world that provides members with opportunities to meet and learn from each other about winter technologies and experiences under the slogan "Winter is a Resource and an Asset."


From the beginning, mayors have exchanged ideas about making their winter cities more livable, with recent focus on global environmental issues, which, because of their broad scope, can only be resolved with international cooperation, the basic principle of the WWCAM.

Major WWCAM Activities

World Winter Cities Conference for Mayors

The biennial World Winter Cities Conference for Mayors (Mayors Conference), a major activity of the association, has been held sixteen times.

Mayors, representing their municipal governments, make presentations and take part in conference discussions in an open and uninhibited atmosphere. The conference provides a forum for mayors to share expertise on city planning, transportation, snow removal, recycling, and other topics. Participants gain valuable suggestions to overcome formidable challenges presented by winter climates. The site of the Mayors Conference rotates among member cities that are willing to host the event.

What's a Winter City?

A winter city is defined by the WWCAM as one that faces harsh winter climatic conditions, including heavy snowfalls and cold temperatures. A winter city also has an annual snow accumulation of more than 20cm (8in.) and an average temperature of 0°C (32°F) or below during the city's coldest month.

WWCAM Subcommittees

The WWCAM subcommittees conduct research and case studies and exchange information on winter technology. The subcommittees for "Winter Recreation and Tourism," "Snow Management," "Countermeasures Against Natural Disasters," "Sustainable Winter Cities Planning," and "Environmental Protection" are examples of WWCAM subcommittees
